THE rolling hills of South and West Cippsland are not alive with the sound of music but rather the sound of gurgles made by glant earthworms going about their business underground.

hese creatures as they many heard them gurght heard them gurght selow the ground white vorking their farms or have ween the bloody entrails leave.

sometimes meet.

The worms are a source of pride for most landowners who know they are lucky to have them working away underground to help keep their soils fertile.

Two such landowners are Alan Gregg and Glenn Duncan who have volunteered their properties at Poowong North and Hallora to be demonstration sites for the Building Capacity to Manage Earthworm Habitat on Farms project.

This 18 month long project, supported by the South Gippsland Landcare Network, DEPI, Dairy Australia and Melbourne Water, culminated in a field day on October 20, showcasing two sites that demonstrate how

Twenty people attended the field day with speakers including Dr Beverley Van Praagh (GGE expert Invert-Eco), Nick Dudley (DEPI), Rob Waddell (Grand Ridge Nursery) and Nicole Walsh (SGLN).

The two demonstration sites were chosen to represent the most common types of habitat occupied by these worms; a wet, south facing hill-slope and a creek bank with suitable clay soils.

The 26 bullocks topped at 188.6c/kg, firm, and averaged 165.1, back 12c, while the 89 heifers topped at 197.6c/kg, up 5, and averaged 163.7, up 3c.

The 55 steers topped at 192c/kg, back 16, and averaged 173.7, up 2c, while the 191 veal topped at 228.6c/kg, back 4, and averaged 186.7, back 5c.

The oversupply in other areas has started to impact on the Thursday bull and cow sale, with 30 bulls sold making to 182.2c/kg.

This was back from the 211c reached the previous week. The average for bulls was back Scents to 161.3.

The cows penned made to 171.2c/kg, firm, but the average eased 12 to 128 for the yarding.

The 29 bullocks sold to better demand and lifted 6c on average to 152.4, with a top of 160c/kg.

The four hectare landslip also revealed the presence of a worm colony at the base of the slip which spilled onto the nearby Main South Road, blocking it on several occasions.

The presence of the slip made this a very tricky site to manage according to Nicole Walsh from the South Gippsland Landcare Network.

"Thanks to additional assistance from Melbourne Water, Glenn was able to fence off the site and then revegetate it with 8500 plants using funds from the Giant Earthworm project.
"A revegetation plan was developed whereby the areas occupied by the three GGE colonies were left unplanted, while grasses and sedges were planted within

a 30 metre buffer around the colonies, followed by standard planting of trees and shrubs outside the buffer area, to help with slip stabilisation.

"This was a huge job and very challenging considering the steep slope," Nicole said.

The group then headed out to the second demonstration site at Poowong along a 150 metres stretch of creek bank.

Areas around the GGE colonies were planted with native grasses and sedges while smaller trees and shrubs were used on the west bank where only one small GGE colony was found.

This planting will provide shade to the east side of the creek where the worms pre-

farmed the district for almost 100 years and were proud to share their farm with GGEs.

"Dad knew about them (GGE) and pointed out a few spots where they were, but we didn't hear anything for a long time," Alan said.

While no gurgles were heard on the day, plenty of burrows were observed in the grey clay soil along the creek embankment.

Signs have also been placed at each demonstration site location.

While most people may never see a GGE, landowners like the Duncans and Greggs will still be able to hear the echoes underground and know that they have protected a little piece of worm real estate.

Funding for the Giant Earthworm project was provided by the Australian Government Community

"I thought they had gone, then when we were pulling out a fence near the creek I heard one and thought, oh, they are here," he said.

"It's like a sucking, gurgling noise. I heard them in a few spots and was quite excited." Alan and his wife Bev have protected 1.1 hectares of creek line which now provides an example of how to plant along creek banks that are home to GGEs.

The east bank of the creek was found to be a "hot spot" Landcare Grant
